ISSUE/ACTION REQUESTED:

The Board will consider amending the General Fund to increase by \$12,602 and the Grants Project Fund by \$58,694.

BACKGROUND/PURPOSE OF REQUEST: General Fund

1. Health

The Health Department received notification of award of \$12,602 from the North Carolina Division of Public Health / Local and Community Support Section / Local Infrastructure and Workforce Support Unit for additional Aid to County funding (Agreement Addendum [AA] 123) to invest in training opportunities that support ACHD's capacity and expertise specific to foundational capability accountability, performance management, and quality improvement. No County match is required.

2. Library

The Library Department received notification of an additional \$8,694 allocation of State and Local Fiscal Recovery (SLFRF) pass-through funds. This funding provides economic assistance to local libraries impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. No county match is required.

3. Emergency Management

- a. The Emergency Management (EM) Department received notification of an award of \$35,000 from the US Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) to fund projects related to the FY24 EMPG program to support the National Preparedness goal of a secure and resilient nation. The grant requires a match that will be met by using current Emergency Management salary funds. No additional funding will be required. Funds will be expended within the next 2 years.
- **b.** The EM Department also received notification of a \$15,000 award from the US Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness Grant Program (HMEP) to be used for projects related to emergency management planning, training, and exercise that pertain specifically to the transportation of hazardous materials. No match funding is required. Funds will be expended within the next 2 years.
